Students entering 6th grade will read:

Elijah of Buxton, by Christopher Paul Curtis, and
The Lightning Thief, by Rick Riordan, and
Where The Red Fern Grows, by Wilson Rawls

Students entering 7th grade will read:

Fever, 1793, by Laurie Halse Anderson, and
Revenge of the Whale, by Nathaniel Philbrick, and
White Fang, by Jack London

Students entering 8th grade will read:

The Outsiders, by S.E. Hinton, and
And Then There Were None, Agatha Christie and
Summer of My German Soldier, by Bette Greene
